SPECIAL NOTES

- The BAJ requires **124 hours** (over 41 three credit hour classes) and **42 of these hours** (or 14 three credit hour classes) must be taken at the advanced level (**300 level or above**). 300-level required courses from the degree program are included in the 42 hours.
 - The journalism major requires at least **36 hours** (or 12 three credit hour classes) of journalism courses; broadcast JOUR majors must earn 3 hours of internship credit.
 - Students may take up to **52 hours** (more than 17 three credit hour classes) of journalism courses. **Students who exceed 52 hours of journalism courses must exceed the 124-hour** (more than 41 three credit hour classes) degree requirement. In addition, students must take at least **72 hours** (or 24 three credit hour classes) outside the Meek School.
 - A grade of "C" or better is required for all JOUR and IMC courses, and each course may only be attempted a maximum of two times. A third attempt will only be granted by an approved appeal.
